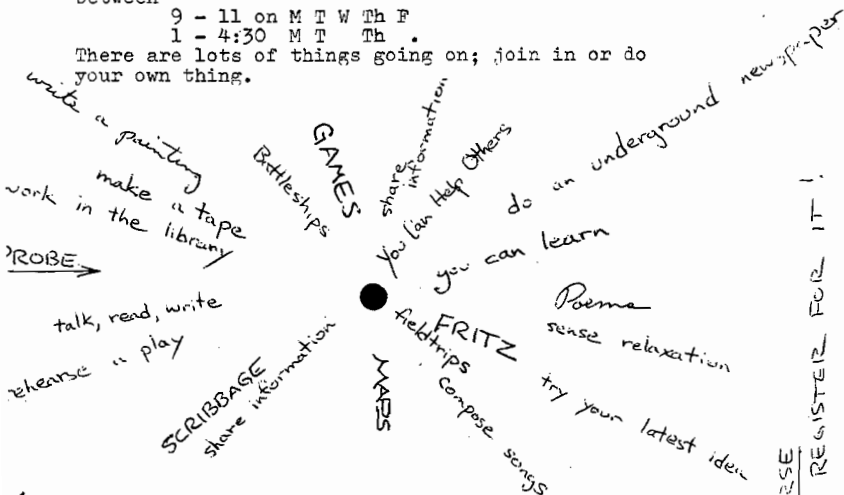
# RESOURCE CENTER

THE UNITED STATES AND WORLD AFFAIRS

A course in world cultures and modern history for people who are not well versed in this field and want to understand what's happening. What tensions are developing in the Middle-East, in Southeast Asia, in the underdeveloped lands newly freed from colonialism, and in the confrontations between new empires like Russia, China and America. We'll try to make sense out of the muddle of history by setting up a skeleton outline of what has and what is taking place. We all need to know what the great powers may do as history moves from crisis to crisis. Where are we going? What has the past taught us? One way in which we will approach other cultures is through the leading figures in other lands: temperaments like Freud or Sartre, Strauss or Huxley; personalities like Churchill, Charles de Gaulle, and Hitler; revolutionaries like Marx, Lenin, Stalin, Castro, Che Guevara, Mao, and Ho; economists like Adam Smith, Keynes, and Galbraith, etc.

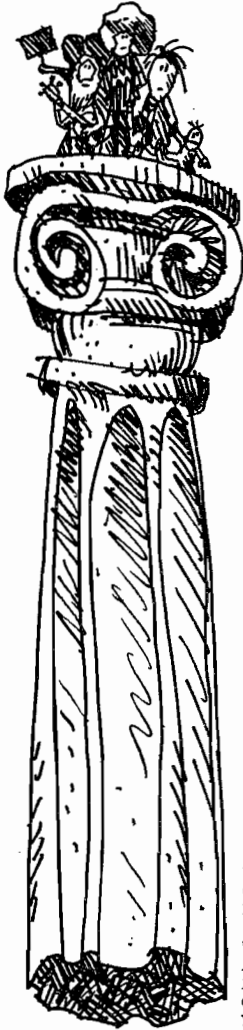

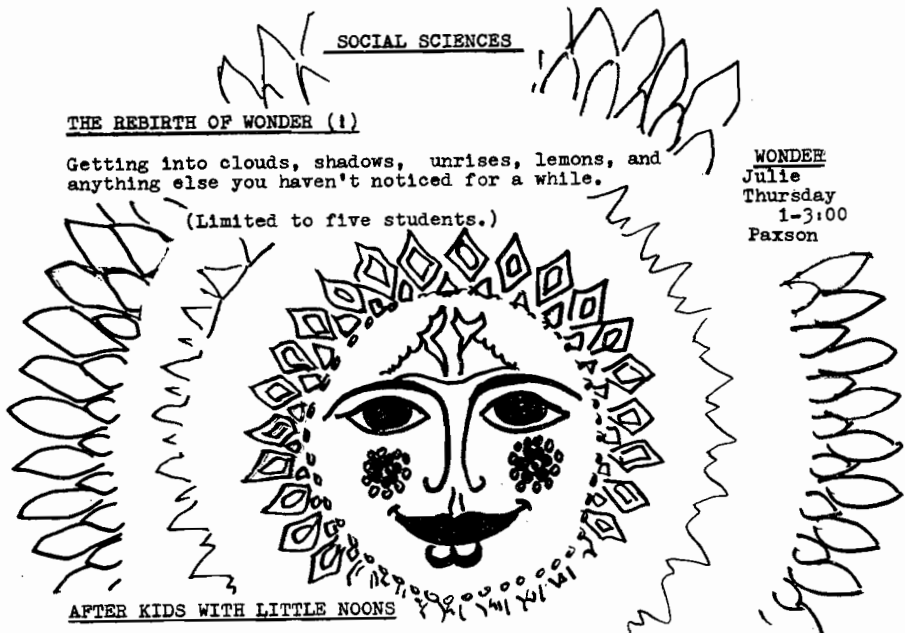
